Predictions/statements of fact

the auxiliary verb will

- Lunch break today **will** be 10 minutes longer than usual.
- In the year 2020 all students **will** have their own computers in school.
- If you help me, I **will** help you.
- Do you think she **will** come soon?
- You won't pass your exams if you don't start working harder.
- I know my parents **won't** let me go to the party.
- Will it snow for Christmas?
- I know she's ill, will she be back at school tomorrow?

prediction – předpověď statement – tvrzení

Intentions

or

you are certain that sth. is going to happen in the future

is going to ... (verb)


- We're **going to** buy a new car next month.
- I'm going to work in a bank when I leave school.
- In the new year I'm going to stop eating so much junk.
- It is very cloudy now, it is going to rain.
- Are you going to play basketball after school?
- What are you going to have for lunch today?

intention – úmysl verb - sloveso

Arrangements (plans with other people) present continuous tense

- I'm meeting my mother at the airport tomorrow.
- Our grandparents are visiting us this Christmas.
- Sorry, I can't stay here now; I'm playing tennis with Peter.
- My sister's going to the dentist tomorrow.
- I'm not returning home for the holidays!
- Are you doing anything on Sunday morning?
- Do you know if he **is going** to the dance next week?

- There's no need to hurry. The train **doesn't leave** for another 30 minutes.
- When **does** the meeting **begin**?
